

Surviving the Global Pandemic

NAAMA 42nd International Medical Convention (Oct 24 & 25, 2020)

Due to the Coronavirus situation, NAAMA had to cancel its planned in-person International Convention and National Convention. Instead, NAAMA held its 1st virtual convention on October 24 and 25, 2020, with 5 hours each day and 165 attendees. The convention was free and offered 10 CME hours to NAAMA members. With two distinguished keynote speakers, Dr Tala Abu Ghazaleh, Chairman Founder of TAG Global Jordan, and special guest speaker Mr. Michael J. Nyenhuis, President and CEO of UNICEF USA, in addition to 50 experts from around the world, the convention earned the title of International Convention and covered the pandemic effects on multiple levels from mental health, to dental and oral health, to the influence of the pandemic on the students and medical graduates, to the pharmaceutical role, to the financial effect to global healthcare and the role of philanthropy, to world updates and the latest research. The recording of both days is available on Facebook on both NAAMA Page and NAAMA Group and our YouTube channel At the end of day two, the winners of NAAMA Best Manuscript Award were announced. They each received a scholarship of \$5,000 and got a chance to present their published paper. During day one, a parallel dental session offered 1h CME to its attendees.

NAAMA Delegates Meeting

NAAMA held its business meeting virtually on December 9, 2020. Delegates from 9 chapters were present. A total of 50 members were in attendance. The Delegates went over NAAMA's work in 2020 and approved the 2021 International Convention, to be held during the 4th of July break in Morocco, and the National Convention, to be held over Labor Day weekend in Southern California.

NextGen News

Our NAAMA NextGen Chapters have been very busy and productive for the last few months. Congratulations to our leaders and members on all their hard work! The University of Michigan Undergraduate hosted events such as the Michigan Med School Student Panel, MCAT Prep Q&A, and the Vaccine Townhall. The University of Illinois Dental School hosted a community holiday chocolate distribution. Oakland University Undergraduate hosted a panel on medical and dental school with Oakland Alumni. Central Michigan University Undergraduate and Medical School hosted a mentorship event to learn more about medical residency. Wayne State University Undergraduate hosted mentorship meetings and held a community volunteering event with the World Health Organization. Loyola University Chicago Stritch School of Medicine served a free clinic within their community. Wayne State University School of Medicine sponsored a session of their institution's Diversity Week titled "Identities and Intersectionalities." Michigan State University College of Human Medicine hosted a post-election debrief event on Healthcare Policy and Advocacy with Dr. Abdul El-Sayed and raised over \$1,300 for "Keys for Syrian Kids." NAAMA NextGen Students for Yemen has fundraised \$19,450, and we are hoping to hit \$20,000 as funds continue to trickle in.

A large part of the project was the social media campaign which aimed to educate on the Yemen crisis and culminated in a "bingo" fundraising graphic. For this segment, we had involvement from over 45 student organizations and 440 educational Instagram posts. Other projects done by student organizations involved with Students for Yemen include a sticker decal sale by the organization Global Marks, which resulted in the sale of 75 NAAMA/Yemen themed stickers, a gift card raffle by NAAMA NextGen UMich with over a hundred entries, and a virtual running event done by the Michigan Running Club in collaboration with UNICEF UM, which had over 9 additional running clubs involved with 110 participants.

We are so proud of our NextGen chapters and are excited for what is to come in the next few months!

Chapter Events:

San Diego Chapter was a key organizer of the San Diego Arab and Muslim Community Coalition, which recently held its fourth biennial Community Forum last week. This year's forum took place in the unprecedented Zoom fashion due to COVID-19 and public health concerns. The forum was attended by various prominent community members, including representatives of elected officials and local figures. We presented a video of the frontline Arab-American health care workers facing COVID-19, as well as highlighting the response of Arab and Muslim-American communities to COVID-19.
